We provide specialist one-to-one support, which is delivered by skilled and culturally competent caseworkers.

Our understanding of intersectionality, and contextual safeguarding, ensures our approach considers the full circumstances surrounding each young Londoner. By building strong, trusting relationships we gain an insight into young Londoners' worlds, so we can understand what they need and together we find the best ways to keep them safe.

EMOTIONAL SUPPORT SERVICE (CSA)



Safer London's Emotional Support Service is there for young Londoners and their families, after a disclosure of CSA.

Our specialist CSA Navigators provide early emotional trauma-informed support to young Londoners and their parents/carers.

WHO THIS SERVICE IS FOR



Children and young Londoners their parents carers who live in South East London (Bexley, Bromley, Lambeth, Southwark, Greenwich, Lewisham).



Young Londoners aged 0 to 18 (up to 25 for those with neurodiverse needs conditions).



Young Londoners who who have had a CSA Medical or where a CSA Medical has been considered.

WHAT THE SUPPORT LOOKS LIKE



Our specialist CSA Navigators provide bespoke emotional support, built around the needs of the young Londoner and their family.




Young Londoners and families will receive specialist one-to-one support with up to eight sessions over 12 weeks, with CSA Navigators attending medicals* where possible.



The CSA Navigators can work with the professional network, including advocating on behalf of the child or young person during a CSA Medical.*



Working alongside the young Londoners the CSA Navigators help them to identify and access future, longer-term or specialist support if needed.



*Safer London attendance at medicals is only available to children and young people living in

As our services are voluntary, we can't work with a young Londoner/family member without their consent and this must be sought before a referral is made.

Once a referral is received the Front Door team will contact the young Londoner/family member to confirm their consent. Unfortunately, we will have to close the referral if the consent isn't confirmed.
